## Wascana Centre's Mammal Checklist



Wascana Centre is home to a diverse array of mammal species. To date 32 species have been noted in the centre. Some species like the White-tailed Jackrabbit are a common sight here year round, while others like the Masked Shrew are very secretive and are rarely seen.

This checklist includes all of the land within Wascana Centre's boundaries, from the manicured Legislative grounds to the tame grass prairie found east of the Ring Road. Most of the species will not be seen throughout the entire park but rather will occur only in certain habitats. The habitats described beside each species are general guidelines – animals will do as they wish – but these are good places to start looking.
