Join the PCC Ecologists on our free Winter Outdoor Survival Program where you will dive into animal behaviours and their winter survival techniques. Register for one or both sessions in February as you learn about animal shelters while you create your own shelter, and about the essential outdoor survival tips while you look at the introductory fire building. You will also be exploring predator and prey dynamics, learning about different predators and prey in Wascana Centre in our animal tracking session. Here you will hone your orienteering skills so you don't get lost breaking in the snowshoes on the Wascana's wintery landscape.
